## One-liners For Behaviour Management

## One-liners 101 to 120

## NOTE:

Character development and behaviour management for parents, teachers and children are inseparably bound up in these One-liners.

- 101 If you show your love to your child by showering them with gifts, make sure they marry someone rich.
- Be a parent first and later become a friend, it doesn't work the other way around.
- 103 It is unlikely a child will have self-discipline if the parents don't.
- 104 Is it reasonable for a parent who does not control their anger to expect a child to control theirs?
- 105 Children won't respect themselves while they consistently practice negative character traits.
- 106 Children learn far more from copying their parents than from what their parents say.
- 107 A child will rarely rise above your expectations.
- Managing children's behaviour can be a most disturbing and stressful task.
- 109 Some accepted methods of managing behaviour are making things worse.
- Managing children's behaviour is like keeping the garden weeded; the longer you neglect it, the greater the task in getting the weeds under control.
- 111 Wrong methods can counteract character development.
- 112 Commitment and conscientiousness will pay rich dividends.
- 113 Focus on proven & successful methods of managing children's behaviour.
- 114 Indulged children become their parent's oppressors.
- 115 It is for children's good to have regular, disagreeable tasks to do.
- 116 Praise a child only when they achieve and they will need praise to achieve
- 117 Practice what you preach is the watchword for behaviour management.
- 118 If you shower a child with material things you are setting them up for unrealistic expectations and great disappointments.
- 119 Ignore a child's faults, and they will grow up believing they can do nothing wrong.
- 120 Even if you do everything perfectly it won't guarantee good behaviour.
