Character development and behaviour management for parents, teachers and children are inseparably bound up in these One-liners.

- 081 New strategies introduced in the 1950's, have not improved children's behaviour, it has made matters worse.
- 082 A wrong understanding of self-esteem can damage your child.
- 083 Behaviour management strategies must be reasonable, logical and do-able.
- 084 'Whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth'; shouldn't we discipline the children we love?

- 089 If discussions between parents and their children are calm they are more productive.
- 090 How do you know when your child has enough self-esteem? You don't and you never will.
- 091 The goal of child rearing is to prepare them to live independently in a responsible manner.
- 092 Children value themselves when they make a positive contribution to the family.
- 093 The best form of family government is a benevolent dictatorship.
- 094 Children will not respect their parents if the parents are not respectful of their parents.
- 095 Don't jump in too soon to sort our quarrels between siblings.
- 096 Don't allow a child to play one parent off against the other.
- 097 Love will tolerate the strictest discipline.
- O98 Your child will leave home before they become what you want them to be.
- 099 Don't show off your children to other people; it encourages self-centeredness.
- 100 A child does not become a responsible citizen without effort and commitment from their parents.
